Lesson 3.4 “Jesus’ Disciples: Empowered by God” Worksheet

Jesus had been teaching his disciples for about three years. Toward the end of his earthly ministry, he had tried to prepare them for what was about to happen to him—his capture, conviction, and crucifixion. Although they didn’t fully understand what was to come, Jesus’ predictions troubled the disciples. In this section Jesus speaks to his disciples for the last time before his death. It is Maundy Thursday, and he has just given them the gift of his Holy Supper. Now we see Jesus comforting his disciples and encouraging them in the mission they are to carry out after his death. But Jesus will empower them to do what he has called them to do.
